He has authored 32 books, the most recent of which are *Speaking My Mind, Which Jesus?* and *Revolution and Renewal: How Churches are Saving our Cities*.

Dr. Campolo is best known for his commentary on religious, social and political matters, as well as his guest appearances on *Nightline*, *Larry King Live*, *Politically Incorrect* and *CNN*.

Through EAPE, Dr. Campolo has developed and nurtured elementary and secondary schools, universities, adult and child literacy centers, tutoring programs, orphanages, AIDS hospices, urban youth ministries, summer camps, and long-term Christian service programs in Haiti, the Dominican Republic, Africa, Canada and throughout the USA.
